Southern Fidalgo Bay is biologically rich with expansive areas of eelgrass and other marine plants and tideflats. This area supports the spawning and rearing of Pacific herring, surf smelt, and sand lance. It is home to salmon, peregrine falcon, bald eagle, migratory birds, and abundant marine organisms.
